NLS DUES STRUCTURE CHANGE

At the 2011 National Lutheran Secretariat Annual Meeting the delegates approved the motion to change the Dues Structure of the NLS to the following:

Year of Affiliation - \$0

After 1 full year - \$50

After 2 full years -\$150

After 3 full years - \$300 or \$3.00 per Candidate / Participant (whichever is higher)

If a Community has one or less weekend during the calendar year ending during the NLS fiscal year, the rate would be 1/2 the regular rate.

NLS Conference Call Minutes

September 11, 2011, Conference call

The meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. Sunday, September 11. Ed Broestl, Carolyn Hawkins, Steve Barnett, Magdala Ray, Pr. Doug Givan, Judy Laabs-Foss, Nancy Peterson, and Diane Purcell were able to connect to the teleconference.

Ed invited all to join him in the prayer to the Holy Spirit. Pr. Doug led devotions reflecting on 9/11/2001 and focused on our "stories". We rejoice that our stories, both painful and joyful, are centered on the Gospel Story. The NLS story now continues on with an executive director joining us, and we know that in every story, God IS with us!

President: Ed introduced Nancy Peterson, newly-appointed NLS Executive Director, to the board. The timing of our mid-year meeting has been changed to October 21-23, 2011, in Denver, CO. He then reviewed the expectations for appointees to the board, including 1) being able to attend the annual meeting; and 2) submitting a report for the NLSAM whether they are able to attend or not.

All members of the board should review our current job descriptions, paying special attention to how each position supports the NLS purpose and mission. The reviews will be accomplished by the following teams:

Ed will work with Nancy and Rick.
Steve G. will work with John.
Carolyn will work with Judy.
Steve B. will work with Diane.
Magdala will work with Ron.
Pr. Doug will work with Paul.

Refund requests for 2011 NLSAM registration number eleven (11), and all have been recommended by the 2011 Host Committee. Carolyn will contact individual secretariats to determine whether the HC should send funds to the local secretariat or directly to the person. Carolyn will resolve this by Friday, September 16th.

Ed related the many God sightings in the committee process of selecting the first executive director of NLS. He has proposed that Nancy start by improving the organization of our database and other resources in an effort to reach inward before we prepare to reach outward.

Her first priority will be to contact the secretariats who could not attend the

2011 NLSAM and then to confirm all local secretariats' leadership, contact information and status.

Our current database is MS Access, and currently, only a few EB members possess the complete list. Ed and Carolyn will work on updating the current database. Diane will help Ed identify and locate a database software program which would allow all EB members to have an access code, enabling them to make immediate corrections and additions to the database as new information is available. Ed and Rick will work together to determine the most appropriate place to store the database online.

The next agenda item was "processes," meaning how each of the EB members break down the steps to our duties and record what actions we take. Each member needs to analyze his or her processes for the next meeting.

After discussion, the EB determined that the process for distributing, correcting and approving meeting minutes will be as follows:

Magdala will send out the draft minutes to everyone on the meeting invitation within two weeks of the meeting. (These minutes will be identified in the footer of each page as "DRAFT.")

The other EB members will then have one week to respond to Magdala with corrections, questions, changes and additions. (Once Magdala has made the necessary changes, the footer identification will then read "FOR APPROVAL.") No later than one week before the next monthly meeting, Magdala will then send out those corrected minutes for final approval by email.

When all EB members have approved the minutes by email, Magdala will send out the final minutes with the footer identifying the minutes as "FINAL" in time for the next monthly meeting. Approval of the minutes will then not need to be an agenda item.

Ed asked the EB members to let him know how we can make each person's job function better. For instance, in the recent destructive fires in Texas, Steve G. could have a pre-approved amount

of money (\$500?) to send immediate help to the local secretariat experiencing obstacles. Diane suggested that each position should be considered for such a "threshold" amount.

Reports/Concerns:

Secretary/Newsletter Editor/Historian-Archivist: The process for recording, correcting and distributing minutes was developed as stated above.

Treasurer/Financial Advisor: Steve B. reported that he will be mailing first quarter financial reports before the October teleconference meeting.

VP – Outreach: Steve G. was not able to attend this meeting. He sent his thanks for all the support for Texas and promised to continue updates concerning any additional needs.

VP – Administration/NLS Distribution Center Manager/Host Committee Chair: Carolyn reported that she will be in Denver October 20 to meet with the Host Committee. The rest of the EB will meet there October 21-23. All EB members traveling to Denver for the mid-year meeting, please send flight information to Carolyn. The 2011 NLSAM evaluations will be summarized and sent out to the EB before the October meeting.

Nancy has need of a laptop to use for NLS business; she is currently using a workplace computer. A motion was made to give Ed authority to proceed with researching (with Nancy's input) and purchasing a laptop for Nancy with a spending limit of one quarter of the \$4,000 budgeted amount for the executive director. 1st: Steve B.; 2nd: Pr. Doug; approved unanimously.

Executive Director: Nancy thanked everyone for her warm welcome. She has been taking lots of notes, and she is very grateful for the assistance in selecting a computer and software for NLS business. Her new email address is execdirector.nls@gmail.com.

Ed thanked the board for their prayers; prayer partners were changed for the month of September. The group shared our prayer.

Pr. Doug led the group in prayer for the special prayer requests, all members of VdC communities, the movement, all congregations represented in this movement, and for all the fall weekends being held around the country. The entire

group prayed the Lord's Prayer in unison.

The next meeting will also be a teleconference on Sunday, October 9th, at 7:00pm EDT.

The teleconference meeting was adjourned at 8:50pm.

The Wheel Leading to The Way

"I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." *John 14:6*

As I reflect on the theme of our 2011 National Lutheran Secretariat Annual Meeting, I am filled with gratitude for God's gift of the Via de Cristo method of Christian renewal. We have all experienced that grace-filled weekend and are dedicated to continuing "The Essentials" so that others may know and live their Fourth Day, also.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, a learning process takes place during each weekend. One way to explore the effectiveness of the Via de Cristo method is to view it as a wheel, or a cycle, of learning. By progressing around that cycle, this series of articles will discuss the "why," "what," and "how" of adhering to Eduardo Bonnin's Cursillo vision.

Part 1: Connecting Heads and Hearts through the Via de Cristo Method

It is fairly common to hear Cursillistas, or pilgrims, refer to the connection between head and heart that often occurs during or after a Via de Cristo weekend. Surrounded by visual, tangible evidence of God's great love for us in sending His only Son, Jesus Christ, and filled to overflowing with a new understanding of God's grace, men and women, through the Holy Spirit's power, are called to apostolic action as Christian leaders in their environments. So, why is it that the intellectual and spiritual aspects are drawn together so closely throughout a weekend?

Created in God's image, human beings have been blessed with the ability to learn, and each of us learns in his or her own unique way. There are those who are more creative and imaginative while others look for the hands-on, practical applications of knowledge. Some have analytical strengths, and some learn best by teaching fellow learners. It is one of the gifts of the Via de Cristo method that the Essentials and the structure of a weekend address each learning style group. We will explore more specifics in the next issue of this newsletter.

Allow me to close with a favorite quote of my great-aunt, Morella Mensing, who taught in Lutheran schools for over 50 years: "*Christian education is a happening in the heart.*" Praise God that He has shown us The Way!

NLS FINANCIALS as of November 18, 2011

The YTD General Fund income was \$8,871 as compared to the prior year's of \$3,250. We had excess funds from the 2011 Annual Meeting of \$7,009 vs. \$0 last year. Great work Western N.C.!! We also collected all past due Local Secretariat Dues.

Total General Fund expenditures through Nov 18, 2011 were \$10,055 compared to last year's of \$10,310 through Nov 18, 2010, giving us a General Fund loss of \$1,184 compared to last year's loss of \$7,060. This is due to the timing of when the majority of the Annual Dues are received which is January to May of each year.

Restricted Outreach Contributions were \$2,437 compared to \$1,804 last year. We also had a \$100 donation to the Restricted Fund Raising fund.

Texas VdC was directly impacted, a few community members lost their homes and their trailer was totally burned. As you can imagine, they lost everything in the trailer; tables, baskets, boxes of personal items, blankets, sheets, coffee pots, agape dinner supplies, pilgrims guides, green cards, crosses, etc...all of those things we take for granted that will be available for a weekend. Thanks to a few great VdC communities and the members of Texas VdC, they were still able to host their fall weekends. On behalf of Jerry Jenkins, Lay Director, and the NLS Board, thank you for stepping up and helping this community rebuild their weekend inventory supply!

God is calling each one of us to 'step up to His calling'. As we learned on our weekend, God is calling us to be Christian leaders in our local VdC communities, our Churches and in our homes. We as the NLS Board want to help ensure you have the training, tools, process and support to be the Christian Leader God is calling you to be. Throughout our weekend we are given tools like our "Green Card", our Pilgrims Guide, and our Crosses that remind us "Christ is counting on YOU". We learned about Reunion Groups and Ultreyas as a way to stay connected to our calling. Are you living your 4th Day? We need to be mindful of what it means to 'live our 4th Day'. God is calling each of us to take action, to step up to His calling. We should be in Reunion Group, sharing and supporting each other to walk the path Christ has paved for us. If we think we can go it alone, we're kidding ourselves. We should be attending Ultreya's to feed and nourish each other, (and I am not just talking about the wonderful pot-luck food that is provided!). We are also called to support our local congregations, being available to serve where your pastor needs help. There are many people in our VdC community who have attended a weekend and we've never heard from them again. It's not that they didn't have a great experience, though we know that can happen. It's because the sponsor or anyone else from the weekend, didn't step up to God's calling. We need to remember, VdC isn't about running weekends and introducing people to a deeper relationship with Christ. That's merely the kick off to a possibly amazing journey. But the journey isn't so amazing for many. They don't get connected to a Reunion Group, they are not personally invited or encouraged to attend an Ultreya, yet we often encourage or beg them to join the next team thinking that's the best way to support the new member.

Let's take some time to help each other grow in our faith and live a stronger 4th Day. Let's commit to stepping up to His call and get those not connected in their 4th day connected. October 9, 2011, Conference call

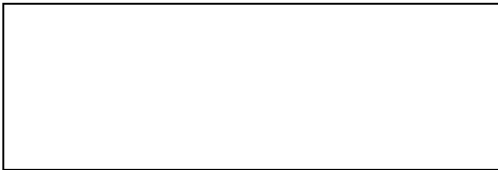

This is the first change to the structure since the year 2000. There are two main reasons for the change. First, we want to help smaller Secretariats who may have 1 or less weekends per year, and second, to increase the NLS's revenue to partially cover our deficit Budget and to help cover the expenses of the new volunteer position of the NLS Executive Director.

Our aim is to have a dues structure that is as fair as possible to all secretariats. The dues you pay help us to help you by providing resources and support for your local secretariat, as well as promoting and expanding the Via de Cristo method at a national and international level.

Dues are due for the NLS fiscal year which is June 1 to May 31 of each year. The amount is calculated based the calendar year which ends during the current fiscal year. They are due each year before the close of the NLS fiscal year, but preferred to be received in March or April of each fiscal year.
